

The Mother's Blossoms most happily provided sports and basketball court equipment at the tribal village school Auro Mira Vidya Mandir in Kechala, Odisha. As we all know

- Sports activities help in enhancing metabolism and energy levels,
- Channelize energies of the children towards healthy and value-added activities
- Build courage, stamina and self-confidence.
- Enhance physical fitness and agility in the kids/youth and results in their overall development.

With the sponsoring of the sports equipment, Mother's Blossoms encouraged children for better health, fitness and physical activity. The children have been using the equipment and practice sports on a daily basis as a part of the school schedule.



Kechla, a village of 6 hamlets, and a few surrounding villages with population of around 5,000 people is an extremely primitive but scenic region in Koraput district of the state of Odisha. Auro Mira Vidya Mandir, is a fully residential school in Kechla. Most of the children attending school are from Kechla village and just a few belong to the adjoining villages.

The main aim of setting up this school was to develop this tribal area by providing high education, vocational training. Ever since the school started 12 years back, it has been growing in its reach and capacities every year. A steady progress has ensured a vibrant nourishing environment for students and teachers alike.



The student strength of the school is currently is 140+ students. The learning of these children is interwoven with the life chores that they do during the entire day. The physical, vital, mental, psychic and spiritual aspects of their personality are nurtured and the children are guided towards greater awareness and conscious living.



The effort is to bring Integral Health as envisioned by the Mother & Sri Aurobindo. Integral Health is a state of being in which the individual's body (the physical), emotions and life energies (the vital), and thoughts (the mental) are in harmony with the inmost self, the Soul. Absence of such harmony manifests as disease or illness.


MIS: Some Enduring Memories



An Expression Of Gratitude



Then the morning assembly, the houses and


the extracurricular activities, annual day celebrations, our drama rehearsals in the evenings.













Mother's Blossoms - Surabhi 2020
